NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde is the largest healthcare system in Scotland and one of the largest in the UK. The Board's core purposes are to assess the state of health of the people of Greater Glasgow and Clyde and plan and provide services which promote good health; prevent ill-health; improve health; and provide safe, sustainable and equitable treatment for patients.

NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde is currently looking for two new members for their Board. You don't necessarily need to have previous Board experience, but you will have either management skills or come from a background working to promote the interests of your local community. As a non-executive member of the Board you'll play a central role in guiding the strategies which address the health priorities and health care needs of the resident population and which will have a lasting impact on the delivery of healthcare in local communities across the Greater Glasgow and Clyde area. As such, these roles are as challenging as they are rewarding – but you will be offered national and local training and a full induction to your new role. These roles take up around 8 hours a week – in exchange for £7,904 a year plus travel and dependant-carer expenses.
